#### Today's readings:

The first reading is from the letter of James, Chapter 1, verses 17 to 27; this can be found on page 245 of the New Testament in the Pew Bibles.

The Gospel reading is taken from Mark, Chapter 7, verses 1-8; 14 & 15, then 21-23; this starts on page 45 of the New Testament in the Pew Bibles.

#### The Collect for today

Merciful God, your Son came to save us and bore our sins on the cross: may we trust in your mercy and know your love, rejoicing in the righteousness that is ours, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

#### Points for your prayers:

We pray for all those involved in education as this new Academic Year begins in schools, colleges and universities.

being a musician who worked as Master of the children of the Chapel Royal, he also wrote plays, and would combine music and drama.

"Lord, for thy tender mercy's sake, lay not our sins to our charge, but forgive that is past, and give us grace to amend our sinful lives. To decline from sin and incline to virtue, that we may walk in a perfect heart before thee, now and evermore.
